COLLEGE PROFILE

Ramban district has an average elevation of 1165 meters (3792 ft). The boundary line of Ramban district are drawn from Patnitop on its south, Assar on its east, Gool on its west and Banihal on its North. The mighty river Chenab commonly known as Chanderbhaga passes through the District. The NH-44 that connects Jammu with Srinagar also passes through Ramban. Government Degree College Ramban is located at a hill top in Village Karol at a distance of 5 KM away from Ramban town on the left of NH-44. It was established in the year 2005 by Higher Education Department-J&K vide Govt. Order No: 155-HE of 2005 Dated: 02-05-2005. Government Degree College Ramban is affiliated to the University of Jammu, Jammu and is recognized by UGC under section 2(f) and 12(b). Noteworthy to mention that the college is NAAC accredited and is one of the leading institutions in the district, offering undergraduate programs in Arts, Sciences, and Humanities with a selection of 9 Major and 16 Minor subjects under NEP-2020. The College also offers Education through distance education centres of IGNOU and MANNU for the students of the far flung area of Ramban.

GENERAL RULES

 - Girls (UG) : Simple White Salwar- Kameez & White Chunni with Black Sweater in Winters (without any designs & hood) or formal Black Coat-Trousers with white shirt.

Note: However, Principal of the College may exempt white chunni & allow Pink Chunni to a girl student who is married or engaged for marriage on the written request of the Parents or Guardians.

- Denims are not allowed at all. No student shall be allowed to enter in the college without proper Uniform.
- All the students will carry I-Cards every day.

COLLEGE INFRASTRUCTURE

CLASSROOMS

This institution has 8 spacious smart class rooms with ICT facilities like smart interactive board, wifi facilities, proper seating arrangement and lightning system. Most of the rooms are also connected with CCTV cameras.



LABORATORIES

The College has 07 well equipped laboratories, one each in Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Computer Applications, Geography and Music departments. The labs are well designed with latest equipments as per the requirement of the practicals to be performed by the students in the labs.



LIBRARY

The College Library has a collection of more than 15,000 books, comprising of reference, text, general, science refreshers, encyclopaedias and competitive exam books. One well furnished reading hall with computers and internet facility is available for the benefit of students of the College. Besides the College has also subscribed magazines, newspapers and journals which are available in the library. The amount of 10 lacs has already been sanctioned by the J&K HED for the Library automation, the work of which is going to start soon



SEMINAR HALL

The College has 01 well furnished seminar hall with ICT facilities and proper sound system which can accommodate more than 100 audiences. The College organizes conferences/ workshops/ seminars and other student oriented activities in this hall.



BROWSING/COMPUTER CENTRE

The college has well equipped browsing centre for the use of students and faculty. The centre has been installed with 15 no. of computers with latest configuration and high speed (300 Mbps) internet. During the vacant classes the students utilize their time in the browsing centre and are also trained by the computer knowing faculty. Special 2 weeks computer training programmes are arranged to equip the students with computer skills.



GIRLS COMMON ROOM

The college has one well established exclusively Girls common room with the sitting capacity of 30 students having all necessary facilities.

SPORTS

The college has one large playground where students play the games of their interest. Besides the college has also a volley ball court and Badminton court. It is worth to mention that the students of this institution have tremendous talent in sports and bring laurels to institution during inter-district and inter-college championships held every year in Jammu University. Many of our players who excel in the above tournaments are selected to participate in the north-zone championship.

COLLEGE CANTEEN

The College has one well established permanent canteen which provides snacks and light refreshment to the students at subsidized rates. The rates and hygienic conditions of the canteen are regularly monitored by the college canteen committee.

TRANSPORT FACILITIES

The Government has provided 02 buses of 41 seats each for the students commuting from college to Chanderkot-Peerah and college to Ramban town-Seri-Maitra. As per the decision of the College transport committee, a lump sum amount shall be charged from the students. The fee shall be decided with the College Transport committee in consultation with the stakeholders.



CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The College has one unit of 100 volunteers. The unit carries out its activities under the guidance of NSS Programme officer. After the admissions the College notifies for applying to work as NSS volunteer. Every enrolled NSS volunteer is required to put in at least 120 hours of social work and attend one camp of 10 days duration during summer/ winter break in one session. The eligible candidates receive the NSS certificate. The NSS volunteers also participate in special/ National Integration camps held in various states of the country through Directorate of NSS, University of Jammu.

The NSS volunteers who receive/ participate in International NSS camps, YEP, RD camp New Delhi, Best NSS volunteer and for other specified medals/ achievements gets the benefit of PG admissions in various Indian universities.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

The College has recently got approval for NCC unit with sanctioned strength of 80 SD Boys and 50 SW Girls. The enrolment for the same is likely to be started from current session. Caretaker/ NCC officer: Dr. Rabinder Kumar Mob. No. 6005723035

RED RIBBON CLUB

Red Ribbon Club (RRC) organizes rallies, painting competition and debate on healthy lifestyle to aware the students in particular and public in general about various evils in the society leading to dangerous diseases like AIDS.

WOMEN DEVELOPMENT CELL

The College has a Women Development Cell which organizes various activities and interactive sessions regarding the women empowerment. Besides, various awareness programmes are also held where the women achievers are invited to motivate the girl students to excel in various fields of their interest so that they can have financial and social independence. They are also encouraged to participate in sports and other allied areas where they can also prove their worth.

CAREER COUNSELLING AND PLACEMENT CELL

The College has also Career counselling and placement cell which organize various programmes regarding the career options in various fields. They are also offered guidance to pursue higher studies, employment, trainings etc.. Various programmes are organized for the students of the College by inviting the entrepreneur to motivate them for start-ups, to establish own business units so that they can become job givers instead of job seekers.

STUDENT GRIEVANCES CELL

The students of the College can project their grievance through the constituted Grievance cell. The college organize various youth welfare activities for the students of the College which include cultural/ literary/ sports/ academic activities. The talent of the students is also nurtured to bring best out of them so that they can explore it at various platforms which include Youth festivals, Display your talent at University of Jammu and other various prominent youth programmes.

There is an active Tour and Picnic committee in the college which organises the tours from time to time with a view to promote the General awareness among students.

Students with outstanding performance in the academic, co- curricular and extra-curricular activities of the college are honoured by presenting mementos, prizes, medals and certificates of merit.

SCHOLARSHIP AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The following scholarships are available for the students belonging to various categories as mentioned below:

- i. Scholarships for SC/ST/RBA/OBC/EWC students
- ii. Scholarships for specially abled students.
- iii. Minority scholarships

Besides above scholarships, the College also provides financial aid to the students as per the guidelines of the Students Aid Fund.

In no case a student will get more than one scholarship in a year.

MAIN FEATURES NEP 2020

- All Bachelor's Degree Programmes are full-time regular for the specified duration as per National Education Policy (NEP-2020), with Multiple Exit and Entry System at various stages after even semester, from the academic session 2022 and onwards.
- As per UGC Guidelines for Multiple Entry and Exit in Academic Programmes offered in Higher Education Institutions, candidate who secured a minimum CGPA of 7.5 in a three year Bachelor's Degree Programme shall be allowed to continue studies in the fourth year of the undergraduate Programme to pursue and complete the Bachelor's Degree with Research/Honours.
- Admission shall be offered for different subjects under different disciplines, depending up on the subjects being offered in the college, as per the eligibility criteria already in vogue.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO 1ST SEMESTER BACHELOR PROGRAMME UNDER NEP (NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY) - 2020

1. Admission to Semester 1st of the Undergraduate Course shall be open to a candidate having passed the Higher Secondary Part-II (10+2 pattern) examination of the Jammu & Kashmir State Board of School Education, CBSE or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto subject to the availability of seats & if otherwise found eligible.

NOTE:

- 1. Candidates for admission to semester 1st shall have to opt one major, one minor (except the subjects chosen as Major), one Multidisciplinary, one Ability Enhancement, one Skill Enhancement and two Value added Courses for a discipline from the following tables.
- 2. Admission shall be made strictly as per NEP-2020 guidelines, academic merit of class 12th examination and availability of seats in the college.
- 3. Reservation to different categories shall be given as per the Govt. guidelines in the allotted major subject.

PROMOTION TO NEXT SEMESTER:

- (i) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-I to semester-II if he/she has secured pass marks in internal assessment in at least 75% of the papers of the semester-I.
- (ii) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-ll to semester-ll provided he/she has earned at least 50% of the total credits of semesters-l as well as passed in internal assessments in all the papers of Semester-ll.
- (iii) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-III to semester-IV if he/she has secured pass marks in internal assessment in all the papers of semester-III.

- (iv) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-IV to semester-V provided he/she has earned atleast 50% of the total credits of semesters-II and 50% of the total credits of semesters III as well as passed in internal assessments of all the papers of semester-IV.
- (v) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-V to VI if he/she has secured pass marks in internal assessment in all the papers of the semester-V'
- (vi) A student who does not fulfill the promotion criteria (i), (ii), (iii), (iv) and (v) above shall be.
 Declared fail in the semester concerned. However, he/she shall have the option to retain the marks in the papers in which he/she has secured pass marks.
- (vii) A student who has to reappear in a paper prescribed for semester-I to IV shall appear in the subsequent semester end examination as per the dates prescribed by the university.
- (viii) A candidate who has successfully completed three-year bachelor's degree shall be allowed to continue fourth year of the undergraduate programme to obtain the bachelor's degree in honors.
- (ix) Only those candidates who have successfully completed three-year bachelor's degree with minimum CGPA of 7.5 shall be allowed to continue fourth year of the undergraduate programme to obtain the bachelor's degree in honors with research.
- (x) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-Vll to semester-Vlll if he/she has secured pass marks in internal assessment in at least 75% of the papers of the semester-Vll.
- (xi) Candidates who successfully complete their four years bachelor's degree with honors /research are eligible to enter the "Two Semester Master's Degree Programme".
- (xii) Candidates who successfully complete their four years bachelor's degree (research) are eligible to enter the "Doctoral (Ph.D.). Programm" in a relevant subject if he/she fulfills the criterion requirement as per NHEQF

Admission to UG Sem-1 Session 2025-26 under NEP-2020 shall be made on the basis of NON-CUET Mode. While the admission to B.A/B.Sc. semester 3rd, 4th, 5th& 6th (NEP-2020 and CBCS) is made according to the statutes laid down by the University of Jammu and in spirit with the Admission Notification/s issued from time to time. The College at present offers admission in B.A as Major (with subjects such as Hindi, Urdu, Mathematics, Sociology, Political science and B.Sc as Major (with subjects like Physics, Zoology, Botany, Mathematics and Geography).

ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

The college has started offering Four Year Under Graduate Programme (FYUGP) under NEP-2020 from Session 2025-26. In addition to this, the college is providing admission to the already enrolled students (Pre NEP-2020) in BA/BSc Semester-III and Semester-V under choice based credit system (CBCS) of the University of Jammu.

Four-years under graduate programme structure regulations under NEP-2020.

- 1. **Major course (MJ):** Any subject in discipline in which student desires to graduate for 3 year bachelor degree or 4 years bachelor degree with Honours/Research. In Major course each student will study for:
 - a) 62 credits for three years graduation
 - b) 94 credits for four years graduation (Honours)
 - c) 82 credits for four years graduation (Research)

Major courses can be any subject chosen from following three disciplines:

- i) Science
- ii) Arts and Humanities
- iii) Social and Behavioral Sciences
- 2. **Minor Course (MI):** Any subject other than major available in the college/offsite campus from any discipline. In minor course each student will study for.
 - i) 24 credits for three years graduation
 - ii) 32 credits for four years graduation (Honours/Research)
- 3. **Multidisciplinary Course (MD)/(Foundation Course):** Each student will study for 09 credits of multidisciplinary course of 03 credits each from 1st to 3rd Semester which is of interdisciplinary nature from faculties other than major with the condition that the subject opted for shall not be repeated in any semester.
- 4. **Ability Enhancement Course (AEC):** Each student will study for 09 credits of AEC Courses of 03 credits each from 1st to 3rd Semester. It may be Modern Indian language (Urdu), English language (general), Communication Skill and Mathematical ability.
- 5. **Skill Enhancement Courses (SE):** Each student will study for 06 credits of Skill Enhancement Courses of 02 credits each from 1st to 3rd semester. The courses shall be chosen from the basket of courses from National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF) as notified by University of Jammu. The University departments/ respective board of studies can propose new courses in addition to NSQF.
- 6. **Value added Courses (VAC):** Each student will study for 08 credits of two compulsory value added courses of 02 credits each in 1st and 2nd semester:
 - i) Understanding India
 - ii) Environmental Sciences and Education
 - iii) Digital Technology
 - iv) Health and Wellness

In addition to the above, there will be one optional course of two credits each in 3rd and 4th Semester out of the following:

- i) Yoga Education
- ii) National Service scheme (NSS)
- iii) Sports
- iv) National Cadet Corps (NCC)
- 7. **Summer Internship:** Each student is required to undergo 02 credits of internship for 15 days in 5th semester for a job/ professional training in a suitable organization or hands on training or activity based courses at college level in order to gain work experience. The internship shall be under a college teacher who will be designated as internship supervisor. After completion of summer internship student will have to produce a report related to the work carried out.
- 8. **Research Project**/ **Dissertation:** Students pursuing under graduate Degree (Research) shall be required to undergo a Research Project/Dissertation of 12 credits in 8th Semester. The research project/ Dissertation is considered a unique course involving applying knowledge in solving/analyzing/exploring a real-life situation/complex problems/data analysis/. Project work has the intention to provide research competencies at the under graduate level.

9. **Credit Sumary:**

- i) 1 Year Certificate = minimum 40 Credits.
 ii) 2 Year Diploma = minimum 80 Credits.
- iii) 3 Year Degree = 120 Credits.
- iv) 4 Year Degree = 160 Credits.

Note:- Students can swap between minor and major at the start of 3rd semester only subject to the issuance of notification regarding the vacancies by the college.

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)

3 academic years with semester I & II of 22 credits each and semesters III to VI of 24 credits each.

The courses under CBCS for study by a student at UG level comprise:

A: Core Courses:

Core course needs to be compulsorily studied by a candidate as a core requirement. There shall be a total of 12 core papers, with 4 papers from each core subject to be studied in 4 semesters (I - IV).

B: Elective Courses:

Discipline Specific Elective Courses (DSE), Generic Elective Courses (GE), Project/Dissertation to be studied in semester V and VI comprising three papers of 6 credits each.

C: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)

Ability Enhancement Courses include Communication English/Urdu/ to be studied in Semester I and VI and EVS in semesters I and II. Each ability enhancement course is of 2 credits.

D: Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)

Skill Enhancement Courses are to be studied in Semesters III - VI, one paper of 4 credits in each semester and the student will have the option to choose from a range of the choices.

Documents required for admission to UG Semester-I

The following certificates/testimonials must be attached with the admission form:

- a. Registration on Samarth portal.
- b. Provisional certificate in original issued by the institution last attended/ J&K Board of School Education in case of private students.
- c. Marks certificate of the 12th class (four attested copies).
- d. Character Certificate in original issued by the Head of the institution last attended.
- e. In case of private candidates a character certificate issued by first class Magistrate/Gazetted officer.
- f. Three unattested recent passport size photographs.
- g. Two attested copies of Matriculation Diploma.
- h. Reserved category certificate issued by the competent authority (SRO-294).
- i. Original Transfer and Migration certificate in case of students of Board other than J&K Board of School of Education. Also enclose two attested copies of these certificates.
