COLLEGE PROFILE

Ramban district has an average elevation of about 1165 meters (3792 ft). It is bounded by Patnitop in the south, Assar in the east, Gool in the west, and Banihal in the north. The mighty Chenab River, also known as Chanderbhaga, flows through the district. National Highway 44 (NH-44), which connects Jammu with Srinagar, also passes through Ramban.

Government Degree College Ramban is located on a hilltop in Village Karol, about 5 km from Ramban town on the left side of NH-44. It was established in 2005 by the Higher Education Department of Jammu and Kashmir (Govt. Order No. 155-HE of 2005 dated 02-05-2005). The college is affiliated with the University of Jammu and is recognized by the UGC under Sections 2(f) and 12(b). It is NAAC accredited and is one of the leading institutions in the district, offering undergraduate programs in Arts, Science, and Humanities with multiple major and minor subjects under NEP 2020. The college also provides distance education through IGNOU and MANUU for students from remote areas of Ramban.

College Rules and Regulations

- No outsider shall be allowed to enter the college without a valid reason.
- All students must wear the prescribed uniform as detailed below:
 - **Boys (UG):** White shirt with black formal trousers in summer; black formal coat or V-neck sweater in winter.
 - **Girls (UG):** Plain white salwar-kameez with white chunni. In winter, a black sweater (without designs or hood) is permitted. Alternatively, formal black coat and trousers with a white shirt may be worn. .

Note: The Principal may permit a pink chunni instead of a white one for a girl student who is married or engaged, subject to a written request from parents or guardians.

- Wearing denim is strictly prohibited. No student shall be allowed to enter the college without proper uniform.
- All students must carry their identity cards daily.
- Students must attend classes regularly and maintain the required attendance percentage prescribed by the college/university.
- If a student remains absent from the college for more than fourteen consecutive days without valid reason, his/her name may be struck off the college rolls.
- Use of mobile phones during classes, examinations and laboratories is strictly prohibited.
- Unlawful assembly of students is not permitted.
- Writing graffiti, pasting posters, or spitting on walls is strictly prohibited and may attract disciplinary action.
- Respectful behaviour toward teachers, staff, fellow students, and visitors is mandatory.
- Consumption or possession of alcohol, drugs, tobacco, or any prohibited substances within the campus is forbidden.
- Any act that disturbs academic activities, examinations, or campus harmony will be treated as misconduct.
- Students involved in violence, misconduct, or misbehaviour during examinations may face strict disciplinary action, including the issuance of an adverse character certificate, in accordance with the University rules and regulations.

ANT-RAGGING MEASURES TAKEN BY THE COLLEGE:

- Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited inside and outside the campus, including buses and online platforms.
- It is a punishable offence and students found involved in ragging will be dealt with strictly in accordance with the provisions of the IPC and the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.

COLLEGE INFRASTRUCTURE

CLASSROOMS

This institution has 8 spacious smart classrooms with ICT facilities like smart interactive board, wifi facilities, proper seating arrangement and lightning system. Most of the rooms are also connected with CCTV cameras. Eight additional classrooms are being constructed with an estimated cost of Rs. 3.5 crore.



LABORATORIES

The College has 07 well equipped laboratories, one each in Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Computer Applications, Geography and Music departments. The labs are well designed with latest equipments as per the requirement of the practicals to be performed by the students in the labs.



LIBRARY

The College Library has a collection of more than 15,000 books, comprising of reference books, textbooks, Journals, Science refreshers, encyclopaedias and competitive exam books. One well-furnished reading hall with computers and internet facility is available for the students of the College. Besides the College has also subscribed magazines, newspapers and journals. An amount of 35 lacs has already been sanctioned by the J&K HED for the Library automation, the work of which is under going.

Library rules:

- i. Library card is mandatory for entering and accessing the library resources.
- ii. Students and staff must mark their entry in the visitor's register before entering the Library.
- iii. **Handle Books and other articles with Care:** Do not mark, tear, bend, or damage books, magazines and other resources.
- iv. **Return Items on Time:** Books must be returned by the due date (15 days from the issue date) to avoid fines.
- v. **Use Proper Check-out Procedures:** All materials must be formally checked out at the circulation desk before leaving.
- vi. **Respect Digital Policies:** Cell phones should be switched off or on silent mode, and computer usage must follow library policies.
- vii. **Respect Other Patrons:** Avoid unruly behavior, loitering, or creating disturbances.



SEMINAR HALL

The College has a well-furnished seminar hall with ICT facilities and proper sound system which can accommodate more than 100 audiences. The College organizes conferences/ workshops/ seminars and other student-oriented activities in this hall.



BROWSING/COMPUTER CENTRE

The college has well equipped browsing centre for the use of students and faculty. The centre has been installed with 15 no. of computers with latest configuration and high speed (300 Mbps) internet. During the vacant classes, the students utilize their time in the browsing centre and are also trained by the computer knowing faculty. Special 2 weeks computer training programmes are arranged to equip the students with computer skills.



GIRLS COMMON ROOM

The college has one well established Girls common room with the sitting capacity of 30 students having all necessary facilities.



SPORTS

The college has one large playground where students play the games of their interest. Besides the college also has a volley ball court and Badminton court. It is worth to mention that the students of this institution have tremendous talent in sports and bring laurels to institution during inter-district and inter-college championships held every year at Jammu University. Many of our players who excel in the above tournaments are selected to participate in the north-zone championship.

COLLEGE CANTEEN

The College has one well established canteen which provides snacks and light refreshment to the students at subsidized rates. The rates and hygienic conditions of the canteen are regularly monitored by the college canteen committee.

ACCESS CONTROL SYSTEM

An access control system has been installed at the college gate with the aim of ensuring the safety and security of students, staff, and college property and regulating and monitoring the entry and exit of individuals. It also helps prevent unauthorized access to the college campus and maintain attendance and visitor records systematically.



TRANSPORT FACILITIES

The College has a bus with 41 seats for the students commuting from college to Chanderkot-Peerah and college to Ramban town-Seri-Maitra. The Fare shall be decided with the College Transport committee in consultation with the stakeholders.



CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The College has one NSS Unit of 100 volunteers. The unit carries out its activities under the guidance of NSS Programme officer. After the admissions, the College notifies for applying to work as NSS volunteer. Every enrolled NSS volunteer is required to put in at least 120 hours of social work and attend one camp of 10 days duration during summer/ winter break in one session. The eligible candidates receive the NSS certificate.



The NSS volunteers also participate in special/ National Integration camps held in various states of the country through Directorate of NSS, University of Jammu.

The NSS volunteers who receive/ participate in International NSS camps, YEP, RD camp New Delhi, Best NSS volunteer and for other specified medals/ achievements gets the benefit of PG admissions in various Indian universities.

Besides above scholarships, the College also provides financial aid to the students as per the guidelines of the Students Aid Fund.

In no case a student will get more than one scholarship in a year.

MAIN FEATURES OF NEP-2020

- All Bachelor's Degree Programmes are full-time regular for the specified duration as per National Education Policy (NEP-2020), with Multiple Exit and Entry at various stages after even semesters, from the academic session 2022 and onwards.
- As per UGC Guidelines for Multiple Entry and Exit in Academic Programmes offered in Higher Education Institutions, candidate who secured a minimum CGPA of 7.5 in a three-year Bachelor's Degree Programme shall be allowed to continue studies in the fourth year of the undergraduate Programme to pursue and complete the Bachelor's Degree with Research / Honours.
- Admission shall be offered for different subjects under different disciplines, depending upon the subjects being offered in the college, as per the eligibility criteria already in vogue.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO 1ST SEMESTER BACHELOR PROGRAMME UNDER NEP (NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY) - 2020

1. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO B.A/B.Sc./B.Com. SEMESTER-I

1. Admission to Semester 1st of the Undergraduate Course shall be open to a candidate having passed the Higher Secondary Part-II (10+2 pattern) examination of the Jammu & Kashmir State Board of School Education, CBSE or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto subject to the availability of seats & if otherwise found eligible.

NOTE:

1. Candidates for admission to semester 1st shall have to opt one major, one minor (except the subjects chosen as Major), one Multidisciplinary, one Ability Enhancement, one Skill Enhancement and two Value added Courses for a discipline from the following tables.
2. Admission shall be made strictly as per NEP-2020 guidelines, and academic merit of class 12th examination.
3. Reservation to different categories shall be given as per the Govt. guidelines in the allotted major subject.

PROMOTION TO NEXT SEMESTER:

- (i) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-I to semester-II if he/she has secured pass marks in internal assessment of all the courses/papers of semester-I.
- (ii) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-II to semester-III provided he/she has earned atleast 50% of the total credits of semesters-I as well as passed in internal assessments of all the courses/papers of Semester-II.
- (iii) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-III to semester-IV if he/she has secured pass marks in internal assessment in all the courses/papers of semester-III.
- (iv) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-IV to semester-V provided he/she has earned atleast 50% of the total credits of semesters-I, II and semesters III as well as passed in internal assessments of all the courses/ papers of semester-IV.
- (v) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-V to VI if he/she has secured pass marks in internal assessment in all the courses/ papers of the semester-V'
- (vi) A student who does not fulfil the promotion criteria (i), (ii), (iii), (iv) and (v) above shall be declared fail in the semester concerned. However, he/she shall have the option to retain the marks in the papers in which he/she has secured pass marks.
- (vii) A student who has to reappear in a paper prescribed for semester-I to IV shall appear in the subsequent semester end examination as per the dates prescribed by the university.
- (viii) A candidate who has successfully completed three-year bachelor's degree shall be allowed to continue fourth year of the undergraduate programme to obtain the bachelor's degree in honors.
- (ix) Only those candidates who have successfully completed three-year bachelor's degree with minimum CGPA of 7.5 shall be allowed to continue fourth year of the undergraduate programme to obtain the bachelor's degree in honors with research.
- (x) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-VII to semester-VIII if he/she has secured pass marks in internal assessment in all the courses/ papers of the semester-VII.
- (xi) Candidates who successfully complete their four years bachelor's degree with honors /research are eligible to enter the "Two Semester Master's Degree Programme".
- (xii) Candidates who successfully complete their four years bachelor's degree (research) are eligible to enter the "Doctoral (Ph.D.) program" in a relevant subject if he/she fulfils the criterion requirement as per NHEQF

Admission to UG Sem-1 Session 2025-26 under NEP-2020 shall be made on the basis of 10+2 merit. While the admission to UG semester 3rd, 4th, 5th& 6th (NEP-2020) is made according to the statutes laid down by the University of Jammu and in spirit with the Admission Notification/s issued from time to time. The College at present offers admission in B.A as Major (with subjects such as Hindi, Urdu, History, Sociology, Political science and B.Sc as Major (with subjects like Physics, Zoology, Botany, Mathematics and Geography). Whereas Commerce shall be introduced subject to the approval from competent authority.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

The college has started offering Four Year Under Graduate Programme (FYUGP) under NEP-2020 from Session 2025-26. In addition to this, the college is providing admission to the already enrolled students (Pre NEP-2020) in BA/BSc Semester-III and Semester-V under choicebased credit system (CBCS) of the University of Jammu.

Four-years under graduate programme structure regulations under NEP-2020.

1. **Major course (MJ):** Any subject in discipline in which student desires to graduate for 3year bachelor degree or 4 years bachelor degree with Honours/Research. In Major course each student will study for:
 - a) 62 credits for three years graduation
 - b) 94 credits for four years graduation (Honours)
 - c) 82 credits for four years graduation (Research)

Major courses can be any subject chosen from following three disciplines:

- i) Science
- ii) Arts and Humanities
- iii) Social and Behavioral Sciences

2. **Minor Course (MI):** Any subject other than major available in the college/offsite campus from any discipline. In minor course each student will study for.
 - i) 24 credits for three years graduation
 - ii) 32 credits for four years graduation (Honours/Research)
3. **Multidisciplinary Course (MD)/(Foundation Course):** Each student shall study multidisciplinary courses carrying a total of 09 credits, comprising 03 credits each from the 1st to the 3rd semester. The courses shall be interdisciplinary in nature and shall be selected from disciplines other than the student's major subject. A MD course chosen in one semester shall not be repeated in any subsequent semester. However, students are allowed to take under the Multidisciplinary (MD) category the same courses/subjects they studied in Class 12th.
4. **Ability Enhancement Course (AEC):** Each student will study for 09 credits of AEC Courses of 03 credits each from 1st to 3rd Semester. It may be Modern Indian language (Urdu), English language (general), Communication Skill and Mathematical ability.
5. **Skill Enhancement Courses (SE):** Each student will study for 09 credits of Skill Enhancement Courses of 03 credits each from 1st to 3rd semester. The courses shall be chosen from the basket of courses from National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF) as notified by University of Jammu. The University departments/ respective board of studies can propose new courses in addition to NSQF.
6. **Value added Courses (VAC):** Each student will study for 08 credits of two compulsory value-added courses of 02 credits each in 1st and 2nd semester: EVS-I and EVS-II are compulsory courses to all the students except who opt EVS as Major/Minor subject.
 - i) Environmental Education-I
 - ii) Environmental Education-II
 - iii) Understanding India
 - iv) Digital Technology
 - v) Community Engagement
 - vi) Health and Wellness

In addition to the above, there will be one optional course of two credits each in 3rd and 4th Semester out of the following:

- i) Yoga Education
 - ii) National Service Scheme (NSS)
 - iii) Sports
 - iv) National Cadet Corps (NCC)
7. **Summer Internship:** Each student is required to undergo 02 credits of internship for 15 days in 5th semester for a job/ professional training in a suitable organization or hands on training or activity based courses at college level in order to gain work experience. The internship shall be under a college teacher who will be designated as internship supervisor. After completion of summer internship student will have to produce a report related to the work carried out.
 8. **Research Project/ Dissertation:** Students pursuing under graduate Degree (Research) shall be required to undergo a Research Project/Dissertation of 12 credits in 8th Semester. The research project/ Dissertation is considered a unique course involving applying knowledge in solving/analyzing/exploring a real-life situation/complex problems/data analysis/. Project work has the intention to provide research competencies at the under graduate level.
 9. **Credit Summary:**
 - i) 1 Year Certificate = minimum 42 Credits + 1 vocational course of 4 credits during summer vacations of 1st year
 - ii) 2 Year Diploma = minimum 83 Credits + 1 vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacations of 2nd year
 - iii) 3 Year Degree = 123 Credits + 4 credits (Optional)
 - iv) 4 Year Degree = 163 Credits + 4 credits (Optional)

Note: - Students can swap between minor and major at the start of 3rd semester only subject to the issuance of notification regarding the vacancies by the college.
